- 1 cat

for the rest of your life!!!



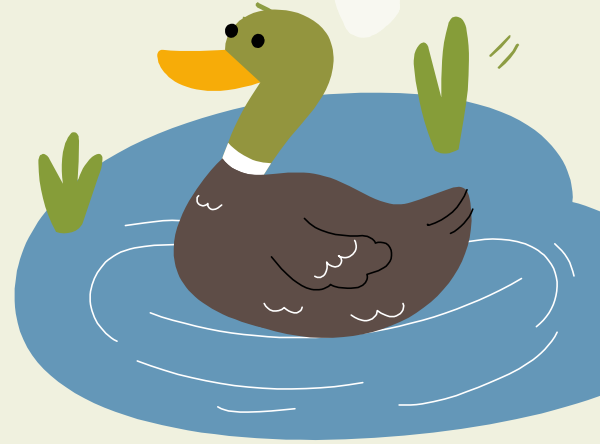
